INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTERS

TO VOTE, DARKEN THE OVAL TO THE LEFT OF YOUR CHOICE, LIKE THIS: ● If you tear, deface or wrongfully mark this ballot, return it to the election official.

Nine (9) propositions are proposed for funding with a one percent (1%) Specific Purpose Sales and Use Tax. Each proposition stands alone. You may vote for or against each proposition. Each proposition must receive a majority of the votes cast on it to be approved.

Shall Laramie County be authorized to impose an additional one percent (1%) Specific Purpose Sales and Use Tax, within Laramie County, to be used for funding the planning, engineering, construction, remodeling, furnishing, equipping, supplying (including maintenance equipment), acquisition and improvement of land (if necessary), and allowed by law, a pledge or payment of operation and maintenance, debt service, lease payments thereon and, if necessary and/or available, to be used to leverage or match federal and/or state grant funds, in the specified amounts and for the specified purposes provided below:

<p>A. \$18,000,000 and interest earned thereon to Laramie County and the City of Cheyenne as follows:</p> <p>a) \$9,000,000 to Laramie County for the remodel and expansion of the existing Laramie County Courthouse to provide courtroom and office space for a 4th District Court judge authorized by the Wyoming Legislature along with building systems and physical plant upgrades, repairs and replacement.</p> <p>b) \$9,000,000 to the City of Cheyenne for the construction of a new Municipal Court to be located at 2101 O'Neil Avenue, Cheyenne, Wyoming as an addition or remodel to the City of Cheyenne's current government building, or for the construction of a new Municipal Court at such other location as determined appropriate.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">FOR THE TAX AGAINST THE TAX</p>	<p>To collect a total of \$11,970,000 and interest earned thereon for the following projects for the Town of Albin, Town of Pine Bluffs, Town of Burns, City of Cheyenne, Laramie County and Fire District #1:</p> <p>A. \$200,000 to the Town of Albin to provide adequate housing expansion.</p> <p>B. \$200,000 to the Town of Burns to construct a gravel road, address parking, watering issues and other needed improvements.</p> <p>C. \$950,000 to the Town of Pine Bluffs to make electric infrastructure repairs and upgrades.</p> <p>D. \$2,350,000 to the City of Cheyenne for street improvements in the area of greatest need as determined by the Pavement Management Program and the annual in-house road and street assessment.</p> <p>E. \$3,800,000 to the City of Cheyenne for planning, design and construction of the Greater Cheyenne Greenway, of which no less than \$800,000 be designated for operations and maintenance of existing and future pathways and system.</p> <p>F. \$80,000 to the Town of Albin to purchase, install, operate and maintain emergency generators for emergency shelter (Community Center) an emergency water source (water well) to be used during extended electrical outages and other emergency situations.</p> <p>G. \$2,000,000 to the Town of Pine Bluffs as funds needed to complete Phase 1 of the Clean Water System Renovation.</p> <p>H. \$390,000 to the Town of Pine Bluffs to construct and maintain a new Public Works facility.</p> <p>I. \$2,000,000 to Laramie County Fire District #1 for the construction of a new fire station located at the Archer Complex to provide increased fire protection and emergency medical services to the eastern portion of Laramie county.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">FOR THE TAX AGAINST THE TAX</p>	<p>To collect a total of \$11,969,000 and interest earned thereon for the following projects for the City of Cheyenne, Town of Albin, Town of Pine Bluffs, Town of Burns and Laramie County:</p> <p>A. \$6,750,000 to the City of Cheyenne to design and construct multipurpose indoor turf facility suitable for youth and adult games, practices and regional athletic tournaments, of which no less than \$750,000 will be designated for operations and maintenance.</p> <p>B. \$550,000 to the Town of Burns for remodeling, maintenance and operations for town owned buildings.</p> <p>C. \$80,000 to the Town of Albin for operation and maintenance of the new water meter system.</p> <p>D. \$1,014,000 to the Town of Burns for completion of drainage and elevation mapping, maintenance and reconstruction of town streets.</p> <p>E. \$3,500,000 to Laramie County for the purchase, operation and maintenance of radio towers and radio equipment to improve Laramie County radio coverage.</p> <p>F. \$75,000 to the Town of Pine Bluffs to refurbish recreational facilities.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">FOR THE TAX AGAINST THE TAX</p>

To collect \$16,176,680 and interest earned thereon to Laramie County to construct an addition on the existing Laramie County Detention Center for the purpose of expanding inmate capacity, for any additional administrative space and for updating and improving existing infrastructure of the current facility.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">FOR THE TAX AGAINST THE TAX</p>

To collect \$15,000,000 and interest earned thereon to the City of Cheyenne to construct Christensen Road between Commerce Circle and US Highway 30 including a new bridge over the Union Pacific Railroad.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">FOR THE TAX AGAINST THE TAX</p>		
<p style="text-align: center;">PROPOSITION 4</p> <p>A. To collect \$9,885,000 and interest earned thereon to the Laramie County Fair Board to be used for the design, construction, equipping, and furnishing of a multipurpose facility at the Laramie County Archer Complex. The proposed facility will be an open-span building that will host a variety of events year-round for both residents and visitors, including trade shows, expositions, sporting events, RV rallies, concerts, horse and stock shows, etc. The Archer Complex was purchased in 2004 by Laramie County as a multifunctional campus for citizens to use and enjoy year-round.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">FOR THE TAX AGAINST THE TAX</p>
